

Quigley Catholic makes honor roll

Quigley Catholic High School is one of 50 secondary schools nationwide named to the Catholic High School Honor Roll.

The winners were selected from 250 applicants based on academic excellence, Catholic identity and civic education.

The honor roll is a project of the Action Institute for the Study of Religion & Liberty, based in Grand Rapids, Mich.

The Rev. David C. Menegay, principal, said the school used to be confused with Quaker Valley, but it has worked over the last 10 years to make its Catholic identity clear, including adding the word Catholic to its name. It also begins each day and each class with prayer, celebrates Mass monthly, has a priest to hear confessions weekly and displays religious symbols in the classroom.
